## Christine Moussa, BScN, CIC

Christine is an Infection Control Consultant for the South Western Ontario Infection Control Network. She graduated from the University of Western Ontario with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. She obtained her Certification in Infection Control in 2007. Christine began her nursing career on a medical/surgical unit in a small community hospital. Her love of infection control began when she was hired as a “SARS nurse” at the Windsor Essex County Health Unit and was nurtured in her role on the Communicable Diseases/Vaccine Preventable Diseases team at the Elgin St. Thomas Health Unit. She also worked for the city-wide Infection Control Program in the London hospitals, where she had infection prevention and control responsibilities for acute care inpatient beds, surgical services, ambulatory care programs, and a large long-term care facility.



## Lisa Fortuna, CPHI(C), CIC

Lisa graduated from Ryerson University in 1988, with a bachelor’s of science degree in environmental health and began her career the same year in Halton as a certified public health inspector. Later, she served as the manager of enteric and vector-borne diseases at the Halton Regional Health Department. In 2009, Lisa received her Certification in Infection Control and Epidemiology (CIC). In January 2010, she joined the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care as the team lead for enteric, zoonotic and vector-borne diseases. Currently, Lisa is the manager of Public Health Incident Response at Public Health Ontario and her key responsibilities include coordinating Public Health Ontario responses to public health incidents and serving as the primary point of contact to receive and triage requests. Lisa has considerable experience at the local and provincial public health levels and in outbreak response, including Listeria in 2008, several high profile Clostridium difficile Infection (CDI) hospital outbreaks, pH1N1 and food-borne related outbreaks.

## Camille Lemieux, BScPhm, ACPR, MD, CCFP, LLB

Camille completed her pharmacy training at the University of Toronto, medical training at Queen’s University and the University of Ottawa, and legal training at the University of Ottawa. She has practiced as a clinical pharmacist, family and emergency room physician, and lawyer. Most recently, Camille worked for the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care supporting the Walker Panel post SARS, and implementing the infection prevention and control recommendations found in the Walker report as part of the Public Health Division. She has recently joined the IPAC team at University Health Network as Associate Director.



## Sofia da Silva

Sofia has held various positions in public health since 2005 including working with the Toronto Public Health Quality Assurance team in Communicable Diseases on quality and process improvement issues. After joining the MOHLTC in Spring 2010, Sofia became the lead on respiratory disease outbreak management. She fast-tracked the development of the provincial guidance document “Antiviral Medication for the Prevention and Treatment of Influenza, December 2010.” Sofia is now with Public Health Ontario, where her focus is on the science of outbreak management and where she will continue to be involved in the ever-greening of “A Guide to the Control of Respiratory Infection Outbreaks in Long-Term Care Homes, October 2004.”



## Letticia Adinkrah, BSc., BScN, RN, CIC

Letticia has been an active member of the infection prevention and control community for over five years. As an Infection Control Practitioner at Canada’s largest community hospital, Letticia provided consultative advice and guidance on infection control to hospital staff and the senior management team. Letticia’s focus was on initiatives to reduce nosocomial infections, through policy development and developing guidelines and educational material for staff and patients. As the Senior Infection Control Consultant for the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care, she worked with partners in public health units to develop outbreak management plans, providing expert advice, ranging from administrative controls to environmental controls in hospitals and long-term care homes. On July 1 of this year, Letticia’s role as Senior Infection Control Consultant with the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care, was transferred to Public Health Ontario.

Tamasine has been a rotating General Technologist in both the hospital and public health sectors for over 20 years.
