To reduce overdose risk:

- * Avoid using drugs alone. If using with someone else, don't use at the same time. If using alone, call or text the National Overdose Response Service (NORS) at 1-888-688-6677 or use the Brave App.
- Take extra caution if mixing substances. Mixing substances, including alcohol, increases the risk of harm and overdose.
- Get overdose prevention training and carry a naloxone kit.
- Start with a low dose and increase slowly, especially if trying something new or restarting use.
- Recognize the signs of an overdose: Slow or no breathing, gurgling or gasping, lips/fingertips turning blue, the person is difficult to wake up and/or nonresponsive.
- * If you think you may be having an overdose or are witnessing an overdose, call 9-1-1 immediately.

The Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act can provide legal protection if you call 9-1-1 to save the life of someone else or yourself in an overdose situation.

To encourage safe disposal of needles and other supplies.

To help prevent fatal overdose.

Services include:

- * Sterile needles
- Alcohol swabs, filters, sterile water,
 tourniquets, and cookers
- Disposal of used substance use equipment
- * Steroid injection equipment
- * Safer smoking equipment
- * Hepatitis A & B vaccinations
- * Blood borne infection testing
- * Referrals to other services
- Condoms & STI testing
- * Information on safer injection
- * HIV/AIDS & Hepatitis education
- * Health & social service referrals
- * Naloxone education and distribution

Safer Injecting:

- Never share needles, water, cookers, filters, or tourniquets.
- * Keep everything sterile. Use an alcohol swab on surfaces, your fingers, and the injection site before injecting.
- Put used sharps in a sharps container or other hard plastic container and bring it back to your needle syringe program site or a pharmacy.
