ADDICTION SERVICES

CHOICES: Drug & Alcohol Counselling for Youth

Provides community based addiction services for youth with substance abuse problems, those at risk & those affected by someone else's substance abuse. Treatment services are similar of New Directions. Although services are targeted to youth aged 10-20 years, the program serves a significant number of youth under 16 years. It operates a full time office in Owen Sound and provides regular outreach to 11 high schools in 10 communities.

New Directions for Alcohol, Drug & Gambling Problems

Provides community based addiction services for adults with substance abuse and/or gambling problems, those with concurrent disorders and those effected by someone else's substance abuse and/or gambling problems. The program operates a full time office in Owen Sound and provides a regular outreach to 7 communities across Grey and Bruce. Community treatment services include: comprehensive assessment, treatment planning, referral, treatment, case management and follow-up. Addiction supportive housing, transitional subsidized housing (8 units), and outreach support/case management for adults in recovery. Addiction Court Support to expedite and facilitate access to addiction services for those charged with drug (or drug related) offenses, Methadone Case Management support of individuals receiving opiate substitution therapy. Saugeen Native Drug & Alcohol Counselling Centre

Assists residents of the Saugeen First Nations to forego drinking and drug dependency by means of awareness/acceptance/treatment of alcoholism. Self-help groups, emergency transportation for detoxification purposed, referrals and youth worker available for teens on reserve. (519)797-2882

Withdrawal Management Services

Provides a safe and supportive environment in which individuals who are intoxicated or in withdrawal can detoxify. Assessment, referral, motivation towards positive lifestyle change and group sessions are provided. Supportive housing can also be provided to clients attending the Community Addiction Treatment Services or waiting for residential treatment outside of Grey Bruce.

Assertive Community Treatment Team

ACTT provides intensive community based services for persons with severe mental illness. Provides treatment, rehabilitation and support using a multi-disciplinary client centered approach. Community Connections: Housing & Support

Provides housing & support for adults with serious mental illness. Housing includes: supported accommodation for up to twenty-six adults in three residential settings; Apartment Program: seventy-five rent subsidies and outreach support; Safe Beds: two apartments that provided time limited emergency housing, outreach support services, counselling, case management, skills training and assistance with activities of daily living. Group Services: life skills training and social/rec/rehabilitation activities. Green House: program provides social rec, education, peer support.

Mental Health Crisis Line of Grey Bruce

24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. A helpline is available for people experiencing distress of crisis. Trained volunteers, supervised by professionals, provide caring and non-judgmental support and work to empower callers to seek solutions to the challenges they face. The helpline reduces the risk of suicide and assists callers to access other services in conjunction with the Owen Sound Hospital's Crisis Intervention Team. Provides assessment, consultation and referral for psychological and psychiatric emergencies.
