MOH Update

Dr. Ian Arra, Grey Bruce Health Unit

- Vaccination strategy continues moving to targeted pop-up and mobile clinics. Progress is slower than anticipated. We are working with municipalities, businesses, schools to increase the uptake.
- More advocacy to the government, including task force letter and key sectors, reflected in an increased appetite at provincial level for policy mandating vaccines.

• Vaccine coverage rate data processes will be adjusted to match provincial population data and demographic denominators. Will better align local reports with ministry reports.

Vaccines Update

- Continue to seek opportunities to work with businesses and municipalities for pop-up and mobile clinics.
- Clinics at school locations begin next week to support back-to-school vaccine readiness. Operatizing underway for in-school clinics when schools return.
- Discussion of promotion of intra-school vaccine rates to encourage vaccine adoption in youth. Example Wellington-Dufferin. Data source discussion.

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Resource Support

- Hubs decommission continues
- 211 call centre received 10,700 calls, centre decommissioned
- Inventory management support from Grey transitioning from Hubs to pop-up and mobile clinics

General Discussion

- Recent court decisions establishes case law with respect to businesses' rights regarding vaccine policy. Includes enabling situationally appropriate requirements for proof of vaccine and rapid test of unvaccinated.
- Discussion of direct/indirect costs to pharmacy operators in providing vaccines.
- Discussion to explore vaccine clinics at seasonal trailer sites for residents returning to U.S.
- Assessment centres will continue to Mar. 31, 2022. Planning underway for expected increase demand on capacity.
- Recent Retirement Home outbreak indicates the success of vaccine coverage as seen by minimizing severity of disease and no hospitalizations in vulnerable population.
- Grey Bruce credited for success of New Zealand mass immunization clinic, 16,000 doses administered in 3 days
