

## Reportable Diseases of Public Health Significance

The following diseases and their etiologic agents are reportable to Public Health as per Ontario Regulation 135/18 under the *Health Protection and Promotion Act*. Please report all suspected and confirmed cases to Grey Bruce Public Health.

**Diseases with an asterisk (\*) and bolded should be reported immediately by telephone and fax.**
