## **Meaford Fire Update**

- Grey Bruce Public Health recommended Wednesday evening that Meaford rescind the do-not-consume water advisory for its municipal water system.
- MOH Dr. Ian Arra issued the recommendation after sample results from the municipal water system came back negative for potential contaminants.
- GBPH will continue to collaborate with Meaford to ensure the public has access to a safe water supply.

#### GBPH begins student suspension prevention plan

- This summer, GBPH's Vaccine Preventable Diseases team will attempt to reconcile immunization records for roughly 4,000 non-compliant students, focusing on students in kindergarten to Grade 4.
- To support ISPA activities, GBPH is asking health care providers to fax updated immunization records for students to GBPH (519-376-7782) following administration or provide parents with a copy of their child's updated immunization record.

## Ministry of Health alerting healthcare providers about increase in iGAS cases

- Increased cases of Invasive Group A Streptococcal Disease (iGAS) have been reported in Ontario in all age groups.
- Rates of illness highest among young children up to age four and seniors 65+.

## Public Health Ontario releases 2023 Lyme Disease Risk Map

- 2023 map has six newly identified areas, including two in Grey-Bruce.
- Provides clinicians with information that can assist with decisions to pursue testing, prophylaxis and/or treatment.

# Health Canada warns accidental ingestion of 'copycat' edible cannabis products causing serious harm to children

 Emergency departments seeing increase in visits, poison centres experiencing uptick in calls due to accidental ingestion of copycat edible cannabis products.

#### Summer stomach bugs

- Campylobacteriosis, Cryptosporidiosis, Giardiasis reported at higher rates in summer.
- GBPH routinely has some of the highest rates of these enteric illnesses in Ontario.
- Common causes of <u>campy</u>, <u>crypto</u>, and <u>giardi</u> include ingestion of contaminated water or contact with animal contaminators (like dogs, cats, cows and chickens).
- Public Health investigates cases of enteric illnesses to assist in identifying potential source and mitigate additional risk, if possible.
- By ordering stool samples for patients with enteric illnesses, Primary Care Providers can help in the surveillance of infectious diseases in Grey-Bruce.

## A WORD ABOUT COVID-19

**REMINDER:** NACI recommends that an <u>additional COVID-19 booster</u> may be offered **this spring** to individuals at increased risk of severe illness from COVID-19, including seniors aged 80+ and long-term care residents.

Rates of hospitalizations and deaths in Canada due to COVID-19 continue to be highest in unvaccinated individuals.
