2023-24 respiratory illness season update

- Grey-Bruce and Ontario are seeing increasing rates of respiratory illnesses.
- Based on PHO's most recent <u>Genomic Surveillance Report</u>, HV.1, a newer Omicron variant of interest, is the most prevalent lineage in Ontario and projected to increase.

December 2023

- GBPH encourages Primary Care Providers to continue promoting COVID-19/flu vaccination to patients.
- Local options for community-based PCR testing are extremely limited. Primary Care
 Providers can collect and submit respiratory specimens for patients. A Positive
 Rapid Antigen Test is acceptable for initiating COVID-19 treatment. Information on
 ordering RAT kits: COVID-19 antiviral treatments and testing.

GBPH investigates new local case of pertussis (whooping cough)

- Case is unvaccinated child, residing in southern part of area.
- Follows several cases of pertussis in unimmunized children reported earlier this year in Grey-Bruce and pertussis activity in neighbouring Public Health Units in 2023.
- Routine immunization against pertussis is important in reducing risk of infection and further transmission in our communities.
- NACI recommends pertussis immunization:
 - At 2, 4, and 6 months of age and between 12-23 months;
 - At 4-6 years (booster) and 14-16 years (booster);
 - In adulthood if patient has not received a pertussis-containing vaccine as an adult, especially if they intend on having regular contact with an infant;
 - In all pregnancies, between 27-32 weeks.

Local Strep A cases continue to exceed pre-pandemic levels

- Number of cases of invasive Group A Streptococcal Disease reported in Grey-Bruce higher than pre-pandemic levels, with cases involving both adults and children.
- Public Health Ontario has published updated <u>Epidemiological information on Group A Strep in Ontario.</u>
- Group A Streptococcus (Group A strep, Streptococcus pyogenes) can cause both non-invasive and invasive diseases, including strep throat, scarlet fever, impetigo, cellulitis, necrotizing fasciitis, streptococcal toxic shock syndrome, acute rheumatic fever, and post-streptococcal glomerulonephritis. <u>Information For Clinicians | CDC</u>
- The Canadian Paediatric Society provides a helpful Practice Point to <u>guide diagnosis</u> and treatment of GAS pharyngitis.
- In some, invasive illness can lead to fatal outcomes. Due to increased activity, we encourage physicians to consider GAS infection in their patients, if indicated.
