WHO IS MOST AT RISK?

YOUNG FEMALES (15 TO 24)

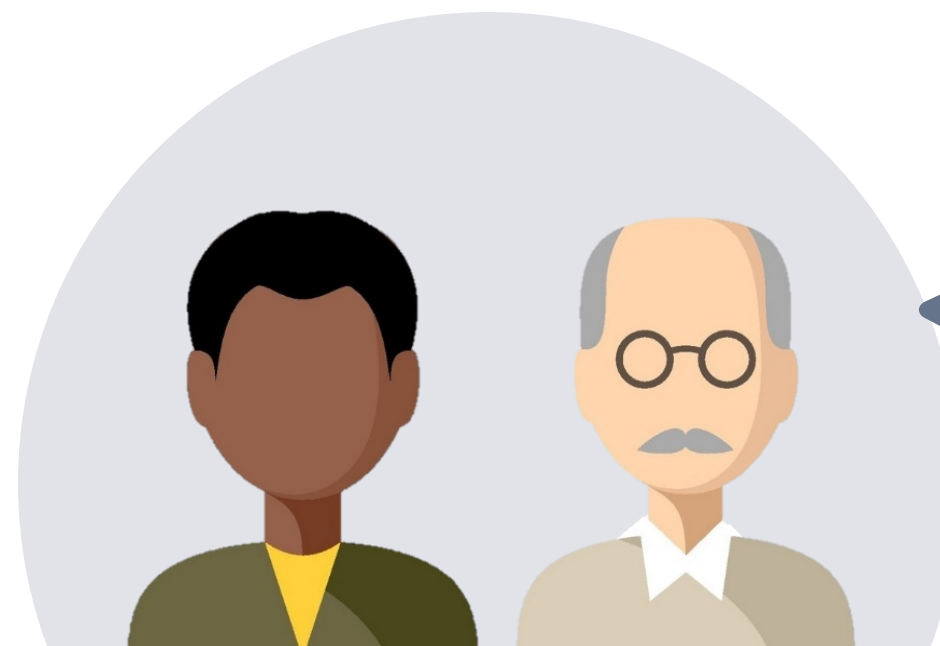
Rates of ED visits for self-harm are increasing among young females locally and provincially. The local rate **tripled** between 2011 and 2017.



Greatest risk of emergency department (ED) visits and hospitalizations for self-harm

ADULT & OLDER ADULT MALES (25+)

Hanging, strangulation and suffocation is the most common method of suicide locally and provincially



Greatest risk of death by suicide

HOW DO WE COMPARE TO ONTARIO?

Overall, local rates of emergency department visits and hospitalizations due to self-harm, and deaths by suicide are comparable to Ontario rates. Among some demographic groups, local rates are significantly higher than the Ontario rate (see below).

With some exceptions, local rates of self-harm and suicide are comparable to Ontario rates
