
TESTING FOR SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS

LOCAL RATES OF **TESTING LOWER THAN** ONTARIO RATES

Grey Bruce residents are less likely than Ontarians to have ever been tested for a sexually transmitted infection (STI).

This is also true of male Grey Bruce residents when compared to male Ontarians.

OF SEXUALLY ACTIVE GREY BRUCE RESIDENTS HAVE EVER BEEN TESTED FOR A SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTION







MALES LESS LIKELY TO HAVE BEEN TESTED

Male residents of Grey Bruce are less likely to have ever been tested for STIs than female residents.

50 TO 64 YEAR-OLDS LESS LIKELY TO HAVE BEEN TESTED

Grey Bruce residents aged 50 to 64 are less likely to have had an STI test in their lifetime than those aged 35 to 49.
