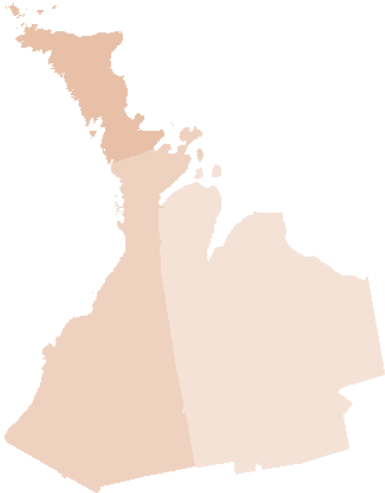


# MUNICIPALITY OF NORTHERN BRUCE PENINSULA

## 2016 CENSUS PROFILE

The following tables summarize the 2016 census profile for the municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula. Indicators are provided with population percentages where appropriate, **and ranked against the 16 other census subdivisions** in Grey Bruce (excluding Neyaashiinigmiing and Saugeen First Nations, for which reliable census data is not available). If the census subdivision is within the bottom 3 rankings for an indicator (based on either an absolute count or a percentage) the figures are coloured orange. If the census subdivision is within the top 3 rankings for an indicator, the figures are coloured blue. Ties in rankings are possible. 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## OVERVIEW

The population of the municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula totaled 3,999 in 2016, making it the least populated census subdivision (i.e. municipality, city, town, township) in Grey Bruce. The population did increase by 6.8% between 2011 and 2016- the third-highest increase observed in Grey Bruce over that time period. The population of Northern Bruce Peninsula is characterized by a high proportion of older adults- the highest in Grey Bruce. Only 40% of dwellings here are occupied by usual residents (as opposed to temporary or seasonal residents).
